Annual Parish Meeting 2019 Financial Report - Explanatory Notes

Outturn 2018-19

Interest Income - The interest rate on our savings account recovered from a temporary reduction more quickly than anticipated.

Charter Court Costs - The very large underspend was caused by three factors - our landlord failed to invoice us for our utility costs this year; we did not need to set aside as much as planned for large one-off projects to do with the building; and we had increased hall hire bookings.

Best Kept Garden's Competition - Unusually this year, we did not need to buy any more award frames or cups, as we had leftovers from previous years.

Christmas Festival - The overspend was the result of having to employ professional road closure barrier marshals for the first time and not being able to secure as much sponsorship as we have done in previous years.

Donations for Village Groups - We did not receive as many applications for grant support this year, and the law/our rules on these donations are quite prescriptive.

Parish Paths Partnership - The year's main project cost around £700, and with there being underspends elsewhere in the budget towards the end of the financial year, we took the decision to pay for an approx £472 project to use up the remaining £300.

VAT (Net of Previous Year) - The council is reimbursed for the VAT it spends, but not until the following financial year. This figure, and any overspend/underspend, are therefore only a reflection of the relative amounts spent on VAT across the two years.

Balances - According to good governance and government legislation, Balances should be set at around 5 to 15% of the council's revenue turnover. The revenue figures here are netted of receipts income, the turnover is about £142,000, and we will need up to £1,800 to pay for our utility invoices when we finally receive them.

Budget 2019-20

Precept - The precept is being increased by a small amount owing to a very slight increase in the number of taxpayers.

Council Tax Benefit Grant - The way council tax is calculated was changed six years ago to exclude council taxpayers on council tax benefit. The compensating central government grant, which pays for the council tax benefit, is meant to be phased out over a ten year period, but because the charging authority previously reduced it too much, we have a surprise, temporary increase this time round.

Staff Costs - Our staff are paid according to a nationally negotiated arrangement, and it looks as if they will be awarded a cost of living pay rise of 2-3%.

Christmas Festival - To keep this successful event going we don't have any choice other than to increase the amount of resources available to it. We are extremely grateful to our existing sponsors, and are striving as usual to obtain as much sponsorship as we can, but we have been hit by a number of cost step increases, including the need to employ professional road closure barrier marshals.

Projects Fund - We are likely to phase out this set aside allocation, as we receive more Community Infrastructure Levy ("CIL") receipts.

[The way developers pay to mitigate for the effects of their developments is changing. With the introduction of CIL, developers pay a set amount per square metre of new floorspace, which can be spent a little more widely than just immediately to their sites.

With the new system, Parish Councils receive a small share of the levy, 15%, and the only requirement on our spending is that it must be spent on one-off projects. We will therefore be paying our CIL receipts into our Projects Fund.]

Concurrent Services - The council has had to allocate more resources to continue supplying dog waste bags to the public free of charge, to prevent dog fouling.

Projects Fund

In 2018-19, the council:

- Replaced the Pound on the Lower Common.
- Paid for three highway anti-speeding signs.
- Commissioned a specialist transport study, which advised the County Council to review pedestrian crossings in the High Street & Hempstead Road.
- Met the costs of the Parish Survey.
- Paid for a major 'one-off' repair to be made to the Village Clock.

In 2019-20, the council budgeted to:

- Contribute to land improvement projects along the edge of the open common adjacent to Love Lane and in front of the Old Palace cottages.
- Implement a flowerbed at the junction of Hempstead Road and Abbots Rise.
- Install history displays next to the village's Rights of Way.
- Implement a tourism sign at the M25 junction 20 roundabout.
- Plan the potential replacement of the hitching rail in the High Street.
- Contribute to the Football Club fixing the highways verge in Hempstead Road.
- Contribute to the implementation of a giant sundial on the edge of the Common.
- Pay for any further efforts in the campaign against Green Belt development.
- Contribute towards upgrading the Grand Union Canal towpath along our Parish.

Away from the Projects Fund, the council still plans at some point to install solar panels at our premises at Charter Court, Vicarage Lane.
