

## 1. KINGS LANGLEY NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN - NON-POLICY ACTIONS.

The table below captures the broader issues that were raised during the Neighbourhood Plan process that fall outside the scope of planning policy, but which are important to the local community. Potential actions and partners are detailed here, but further consultation with the community would assist in prioritising the projects as well as considering where funding may be sourced from to deliver them.
